



# Part VII Transfers – a practical guide

# **Course Description**

This is an intensive half day course to provide practical guidance on the building blocks involved in successfully implementing a part VII transfer scheme. The course will address scheme objectives, legal procedures, timetabling court dates and procedural stages, the role of the FSA and other regulators, the Independent Expert and issues arising post-transfer.

## Target Audience

The course is intended for managers and proprietors of companies and their professional advisors who are likely to be directly involved in the implementation of a part VII transfer scheme.

## **Course Objectives**

To inform delegates of the practical stages involved in implementing a part VII transfer scheme. Delegates will be made aware of the procedural stages required under the legislation, the significance of the FSA and the role of the Independent Expert. The emphasis is on practical issues with specific examples of the documentation required, the dialogue required with the FSA and areas where waivers may be sought in order to reduce costs and the time required for implementation.

#### **Course Format**

The course will be presented in a seminar format with interaction and dialogue between delegates and presenters strongly encouraged. The course will be presented by a solicitor and an independent actuary who have considerable experience in the field. There will be contributions from managers of businesses who were either transferees or transferors. A variety of real case studies will be used in the presentation and as sample documents to take away.

# **Course Content**

- Explain the steps involved in establishing a part VII transfer scheme
- Set out pros and cons compared with a solvent scheme or a sale
- Legislative and procedural stages, and their timing
- The position and role of the FSA and other regulators
- Identify areas amenable to short-cuts in the process
- Key documentation required
- The factors to be considered by the Independent Expert
- The role of legal advisors
- Court procedure
- Issues arising following an affirmative court order

# **Pre-requisites**

The course will be most relevant to the managers or proprietors of businesses considering implementing the part VII route in order to achieve finality of some segment of their business.
